THINK SNOW! Ski Trip Plan Mont Tremblant Mar. 23 – 30 (08)

While we are enjoying the summer sun and fun with friends, Warren and I are thinking about winter and fun in the snow. This past season the snow was very sporadic around here, and only a little bit better in Vermont – at least for cross-country skiers like us. We have decided to seek out snow, searching as far north as Quebec. We have located several chalets, which will house up to 12 people in comfort. Would you be interested in a week of fabulous cross-country skiing?? If there are enough people interested in this idea, we will book a chalet. One chalet has an indoor pool, some have saunas, and all have fireplaces, full kitchens, linen provided, washer/dryer and more. If you are also a downhill skier, Mont Tremblant is an easy ride down the road. We are looking at the area just south of Mont Tremblant where cross-country trails go on for miles and miles. We would like to maximize the winter season around here, and extend skiing into late spring, which is still good skiing up north, probably the week of March 23, 2008. Ride Information
